An AusrosePromotions Initiative WHAT IS AN AUSBRED ROSE?

An Australian Bred Rose (Ausbred Rose) is one that has been bred in Australia by a breeder taking pollen from one rose bloom and fertilising another with it. Eventually the fertilized bloom produces a hip(seed pod) from which seeds are harvested then sewn in seed growing mix. The resultant rose is Australian bred the like of Governor Marie Bashir, Amazing Grace, Joyce Abounding, Lorraine Lee, Dame Nellie Melba etc.

Roses such as Good Samaritan, Mister Lincoln, Pope John Paul 11 and all the David Austin Roses etc. were bred overseas and know as exotic roses. Cuttings of such roses are sent to Australia. Nurserymen take buds from these cuttings and graft them onto rootstock. The rose which results is an overseas bred rose grown in Australia. Sometimes these roses are named iconic Australian names for marketing purpose and some wrongly believe the roses are Australian bred. e.g. Slim Dusty, Ian Thorpe, City of Newcastle, Black Caviar etc.

A big majority of roses available in Australia are bred overseas. One of the ultimate aims of AusrosePromotions is to change this so breeding roses by Australians become a viable proposition for those rosarians who wish to breed roses commercially

An outstanding exhibition white hybrid tea rose bred by Dr Bruce Chapman, Beaumaris Melbourne. during 2005. Amazing Grace 07 was introduced in 2007 by Ross Roses in South Australia. The rose is a proven performer in our hot climate and it is hard to fault. It has large, pure white classic blooms approximately 9 cm in diameter with a delightful floral fragrance and a good long stems. almost thornless, on a well shaped 1.4 m by 1 m bush. The bush usually produces a single rose per stem and the dark green foliage is glossy and healthy with excellent disease resistance.

Bred by Graham Sargeant Gra's Blue is a mauve blend miniflora that is one of the first roses to flower in the garden and flowers continuously throughout the season. The bush has few thorns, grows to a height of 25 cm and has flowers with a 5cm diameter. A Bronze Medal in the The National Trial Garden Annual Awards in 2015 is a testament to Gra's Blue disease resistance. As the winner of Governor of Gifu's Award for the the rose for the most fragrance in the 2015 trials puts Gra's Blue in a special class.

Bred by Richard Walsh 100 Not Out was selected as the Signature Rose for the Rose Society of NSW Inc. Centenary of 2013. A competition to name the rose was run by the Rose Society of NSW Inc. and it was won by Steve Maher of Goulburn. None to mild fragrance. Average diameter 10cm. Medium to large, full (26-40 petals), borne mostly solitary bloom form. Blooms in flushes throughout the season. Medium, bushy, upright. Medium, semi-glossy, medium green foliage. Height of up to 120 cm. Won the Davis Trophy for the Best Australian Bred Rose in 2011 National Rose Trials Gardens of Australia. On the show bench 100 Not Out was Grand Champion at NBMH Regional Rose Show in 2014. The rose has made its way across the across the ditch and is being sold in New Zealand as Our Amelia.



One of Ross Roses True Blue Rose Collection Howard Florey was released in 1998. This floribunda rose has prolific clusters of rich apricot buds that soften as the blooms mature. The double blooms with 16-25 petals have a fresh fragrance of cloves with a touch of lemon. New growth is an attractive bronze shade that greens as the bush gets older. It grows to around 1m tall and makes a good standard or low hedge. This is one variety that needs no regular pruning. Bred by George Thomson the rose was named to honour Australian medical scientist Howard Florey who contributed greatly to the development

and use of penicillin.

Elizabeth Frankhausen-bred for Australian conditions June, 2018

Elizabeth Frankhauser is a double, fragrant, soft pink rose that is deeper at the petal edges and having 35 petals. Fully recurrent the foliage is deep green and the bush is 1.25m X 1m. The rose was bred by Des Frankhauser who named it after his mother. Des was a teacher at Hopetoun High School (Victoria) until the late 1960s. During his time at the high school he was the founding President of the South Malee Rose club. On his retirement the family moved to Rosebud, Victoria. Of the twelve roses he released only Elizabeth Frankhauser is still available in nurseries.

RED GEM (Ausbred Rose)

Coming from the same seedpod as Joyce Abounding, Red Gem as yet, hasn't gained the popularity or had the success on the show bench Joyce Abounding has had. Bred by Dr Bruce Chapman and introduced to Australia in 2010 by Ross Roses, Red Gem is a miniflora with red exhibition style blooms that are very full. The bush is compact with glossy green foliage and an abundance of blooms either singularly or in small clusters. The rose has been shown very successfully in NSW by Mark McGuire over a number of years. Like Joyce Abounding Red Gem strikes readily and does very well on its own roots.



Minnie Watson

Bred for Australian Conditions September 2018

Minnie Watson was bred by Richard (Dick) Watson of Warrane, Tasmania in 1965. The rose is most unusual as the seedling was the result of a self-pollinated seed of Dickinson's Flame. A compact bush with glossy foliage, salmon semi-double blooms with a lighter reverse that are slightly fragrant. In 1982 Australian Rosarians were bestowed a great honour when a set of four stamps came out depicting Australian bred roses. Minnie Watson(65c) was one the four stamps chosen for the stamps along with Marjorie Atherton (27c), Imp (40c), and Satellite (75c). The rose varieties were selected in consultation with the National Rose Society of Australia. Minnie Watson was named after the breeder's mother

One of the original twenty roses released by Warren Millington through Hannemann Nurseries for the 2018 bare root season Morpheus has been extremely popular and out sold the other nineteen of the twenty released. An almost thornless bush with light pink blooms that are mostly solitary and have a cupped bloom form. Excellent health and the ability to produce large quantities of long stemmed light pink blooms which aged to green. The blooms are very long lasting on the bush. This is the perfect rose for those who like to flower arrange. For those in Sydney potted Warren Millington roses can be purchased from Mother Earth Nursery Annangrove Rd, Kenthurst.

The most well known of the six roses nonagenarian Marguerite Parkes bred and registered Sharon Louise is named after the breeder's grand daughter. Bred to be a and outstanding rose being Queen Elizabeth X Virgo the rose has inherited traits from both parents. Grown on a compact upright bush the blooms are pale pink and with a deeper coloured pink centre and almost white reverse. The average diameter of the mildly fragrant blooms is 10 cm and they have 38 petals. Although not shown regularly the rose has done well in the decorative class over the years and in 2017 won the Champion Decorative Class at the the McArthur Autumn Rose Show. Marguerite was honoured by the Hunter Region Rose Society with a rose garden containing many of her roses at the Maitland Visitor Information Centre.


