It gives me great pleasure to announce the 2019 Australian Bred Rose of the Year. This is the seventh year this award has been made and is the brainchild of Ausrose Promotions CEO Doug Hayne as a tool to promote Australian Bred Roses. The winners and breeders to date have been: -2013 Joyce Abounding (Dr Bruce Chapman), 2014 Flemington Racecourse (Dr Bruce Chapman), 2015 Imp (George Dawson), 2016 China Sunrise (Laurie Newman), 2017 Love's Gift (George Thomson), 2018 Amazing Grace (Dr Bruce Chapman). To date, Dr Bruce Chapman has been the most successful breeder with three wins.

Criteria used to select the Australian Bred Rose of the Year includes performance and official rose trials, individual's assessment (disease resistance, robustness of bush, longevity in catalogues, vigour, number of flowers in a flush, number of flushes in a year, fragrance), popular vote from description and photo. All these are combined to give a final assessment.

This year after all the data is taken into account a new breeder **Bruce Brundrett** won the award with the floribunda My Yellow.

My Yellow is exceptionally quick to produce fragrant blooms, with new growth commencing before the blooms are spent. The colour rarely fades with the sun, usually deepening the yellow hue to orange flushes. The blooms have a strong fragrance and the bushes grow to a height to 80cm. Winner of a Silver Medal and Davis Trophy for the Best Australian Bred Rose at the Year National Rose Trial Garden of Australia.



### **ULURU/AYER'S ROCK**

Uluru also known as Ayers Rock and officially gazetted as Uluru / Ayers Rock, is a large sandstone rock formation in the southern part of the Northern Territory in central Australia. It lies 335 km (208 mi) south west of the nearest large town, Alice Springs. Uluru is sacred to the Pitjantjatjara Anangu, the Aboriginal people of the area. The area around the formation is home to an abundance of springs,



waterholes, rock caves and ancient paintings. Uluru is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Uluru and Kata Tjuta, also known as the Olgas, are the two major features of the Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park.

## **RISING STAR**

As the result of the increased interest in Australia Bred Roses(aka-Ausbred Roses) in recent years there is a greater number of rosarians turning to breeding. Our Amanda is an Australian bred floribunda with informal clustered blooms in blended pink and cream, flowering throughout the season with a gentle fragrance. The blooms are delight in the garden and perfect in a vase. The bush is medium sized with dark green foliage and a height is : up to 110cm.

Bred by Ruth/Richard Walsh the rose is named after Amanda Ceruti daughter of high profile NSW rosarian Rosie Ceruti.

Our Amanda will be available for sale bare rooted in Winter 2020 through Wagner's Rose Nursery.

# AUSTRALIAN BRED ROSE OF THE MONTH Governor's Wife

Bred for Australian Conditions

January 2020

The concept of a NSW Governor's Wife celebration rose was put to Doug and Glynis Hayne by The then Governor of NSW General David John Hurley AC, DSC, FTSE's wife Mrs Linda Hurley.

After discussion it was decided for the project to proceed and be administered by the Rose



Society of NSW Inc. A number of roses were submitted to Mrs Hurley for consideration. She chose a rose bred by a Maitland-based breeders Richard and Ruth Walsh.

An orange-pink Grandiflora, the blooms are very full with a 10.795cm average diameter and a moderate fragrance. The rose had an official launch with a ceremonial planting at a morning tea at Government House Sydney on August 24th 2017.

The rose is available from Treloar Roses.

## MORNINGTON BOTANICAL ROSE GARDEN



To celebrate the garden's tenth anniversary it was decided to have a celebration rose.

In 2009 member of MBRG approached local rose breeder Dr Bruce Chapman to breed a rose for the rose garden. Bruce had a Floribunda rose that was unnamed and that rose is now our lovely *Mornington*.

*Mornington* was introduced into Australia in 2010 by Treloar roses. *Mornington* is a Floribunda rose producing stunning blooms of dark pink magenta with a delicate white trim and very strong fragrance. Grows to a height of up to 120 cm and width of 90 cm.
